What is <u>not</u> allowed in a Front Load dumpster?

Electronics & Appliances - Televisions, Refrigerators, Computers, AC units, Microwaves, Washers/Dryers—a majority of general household appliances are not allowed to be thrown in the dumpster.

Paint, Stains, and Lacquers - You cannot throw paint, paint thinners, lacquers, or wood stains in a dumpster. If you have leftover latex paint that can't be reused or recycled, allow the paint to solidify by pouring it into a box with kitty litter or shredded paper. Once it's hard and dry, toss it in the dumpster.





Hazardous Waste - (Flammable Liquids/Chemicals, Poisons & Asbestos) - Asbestos, pesticides, propane tanks, household cleaners, ink and resins, contaminated soil or absorbents, and medical waste should never be put in a dumpster.

<u>Whole Tires</u> - Because landfills do not accept whole tires, you cannot put whole tires in a dumpster. Be sure to tear them up first.



Furniture - Couches, tables, chairs, mattresses—almost all types of bulky furniture are not accepted in the dumpsters. <u>Auto Fluids</u> - Motor Oil, Coolant, Transmission Fluid, Anti-Freeze, Lubricating Oil, Hydraulic Oil or any other automotive fluids are not allowed to be put in the dumpsters.



Construction Debris -

Brick, Stone, Concrete, Asphalt, Roofing Shingles and Large pieces of Renovation Debris cannot be thrown in the dumpster. Be sure to break down large pieces into smaller pieces.

Batteries - Car batteries and dry-cell batteries cannot be put in a dumpster because they can leak chemicals that harm the environment.
